- ❑ Align to Government for go back to school initiative.

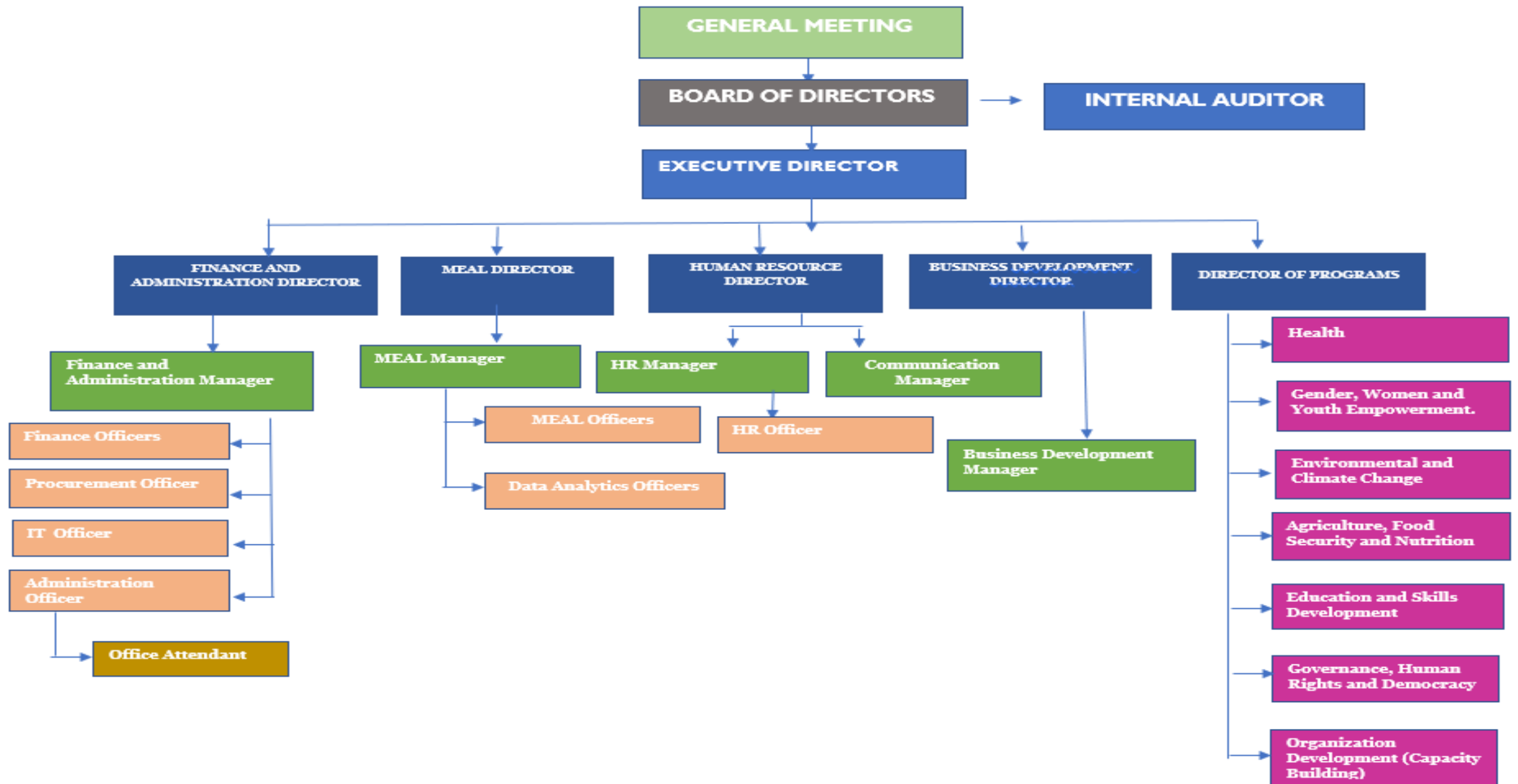

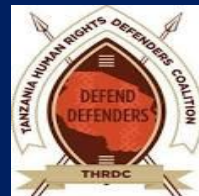
